2022 LONG-TERM RECOVERY PROGRAM

Disaster Response typically lasts 2-6 weeks after the storm, followed by a transition to **Disaster Long-Term Recovery** rebuilding efforts that last up to 1-4 years after the storm.

Inspiritus provides expert Long-Term Recovery services to communities in need, including: Case Management, Construction Management, Volunteer Management, and Long-Term Recovery Capacity Building.

IN-FOCUS: HURRICANE IAN DISASTER RESPONSE

Hurricane Ian was considered one of the most powerful storms to ever hit the U.S.

With max wind speeds of 155 mph, Ian caused catastrophic damage with losses currently estimated to reach \$67 billion dollars. Damage was mostly from flooding, particularly impacting the cities of Fort Myers Beach and Naples, FL. Sections of Fort Myers were overwhelmed with a 15-foot storm surge, raging floodwaters and winds after the historic storm touched down as a high-level Category 4. Millions were left without power and water in the storm's wake, and many residents were forced to take refuge on their roofs or succumbed to drowning. In total, Hurricane Ian has caused at least 130 fatalities.



Inspiritus Disaster Relief teams are on the ground in Fort Myers, FL, and the surrounding area, providing free Debris Removal, Muck & Gut, Roof Tarping, Mold Sanitation, Chainsaw and Heavy Equipment services for the most vulnerable homeowners. Inspiritus staff are also partnering with local emergency and city/county officials to build local disaster Response & Recovery capacity, providing expert disaster advisement to leaders and residents in SW Florida.

IN-FOCUS: W. KY TORNADOES RESPONSE

On December 10, 2021, Mayfield, KY was hit by the deadliest tornado outbreak in the state's history. Severe storms swept through the American heartland, including an EF-4 tornado that carved out a path stretching 165.7 miles across Kentucky. This storm brought 190 mph winds, and damaged or destroyed more than 60 businesses in the town of just 10,000 people. Sadly, 80 individuals lost their lives.



Inspiritus Disaster Relief teams were deployed, immediately assisting tornado survivors with free debris removal, muck & gut, mold sanitation, chainsaw, and heavy equipment services. Our teams will remain on the ground, empowering tornado survivors in W. KY. now through October 2023.

IN-FOCUS: E. KY FLOOD RESPONSE

In July 2022, severe thunderstorms brought heavy rain, deadly flash flooding, and devastating river flooding to Eastern Kentucky. The overwhelming amounts of rain and resultant flooding led to 39 deaths and widespread catastrophic damage. In some communities, entire homes were swept away by flood waters, leading to costly damage to infrastructure. Over 600 helicopter rescues and countless swift water rescues by boat were needed to evacuate people who were trapped by the quickly-rising flood waters.



Inspiritus quickly deployed a team to East Kentucky to provide the critical help needed after these flash floods. Inspiritus team leaders helped homeowners navigate FEMA and volunteers worked tirelessly to clean up the debris from flood ravaged homes. Additionally, our response teams cleared 36 road blockages, repaired 3 culverts, and cleared 20 drainage waterways, across 4 counties in East Kentucky.

IN-FOCUS: WAVERLY FLOOD RECOVERY

On Aug. 21, 2021, very heavy rainfall resulted in widespread flash flooding across western Middle Tennessee, including the town of Waverly. In this catastrophic event, Waverly was severely damaged by floodwater, with hundreds of homes and dozens of businesses destroyed and swept away. Numerous people became trapped, leading to widespread water rescues. The event resulted in 19 fatalities in the small community of Waverly, The flood is estimated to have caused \$23.9 million in damage throughout Tennessee.



Inspiritus Disaster Response teams were quickly deployed to Waverly, TN to provide the critical help needed after this devastating storm. Our team established a Volunteer Reception Center (VRC), helped manage the Distribution Resource Center (DRC), while actively deploying volunteers to provide debris removal and muck & gut services to those in need.

- Further developed our new Recovery Tracking Database (tracking our financials, funding, stats, etc.)
- Developing a new Volunteer Management Database
- Building & growing Partnerships to support local community needs
- Purchased and built-out a new Response Tool Trailer
- Expanded our Tool/Equipment Inventory and developed an Inventory Tracker
- Increased volunteer numbers by 90-95% in 2021-2022
- Submitted and received much needed grants to help fund our work
- Completed multiple projects while meeting or exceeding expected outcomes
- Hired and trained staff for our new Recovery Programs
- Served despite the impact of COVID-19 on our staff & communities
- Inspiritus is a proud member of several state and regional VOADS (Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster). Our team works diligently to stay updated and provide assistance to our various VOAD partners when disaster strikes.
